

ORDINANCE NO. 661-05-17

ESTABLISHING RATES OF PAY FOR VILLAGE EMPLOYEES, AND
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village Council declares this to be an ordinance necessary for the public health, safety and orderly administration of the Village, and

WHEREAS, the Village Council has reviewed the job performance and responsibilities of the positions of Village Administrator/Zoning-Building Inspector, Village Clerk-Treasurer, Village Chief of Police and personnel of the Village Police, Village Utilities and Village office, and

WHEREAS, in view of the responsibilities associated with each of the aforesaid positions, the Village Council has determined that the pay scale herein established for each of said positions is fair and appropriate, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF ROAMING SHORES, OHIO:

Section 1: Effective on the May 1, 2017, or on any later date of appointment of any position herein referenced, the following rates of pay shall be applicable for the employees subject to this Ordinance:

- a. Village Administrator/Zoning-Building Inspector (20 hours/PT) \$27,285.00 annually
- b. Village Clerk-Treasurer \$23,001.00 annually
- c. Village Office Manager \$36,597.60 annually.
- d. Village Chief of Police \$55,000 annually.
- e. Village Sargent of Police \$19.00 per hour
- f. Village Police Patrol Officer \$17.00 per hour
- g. Village Probationary Police Patrol Officer \$16.00 per hour
- h. Village Police Part-Time Officer \$14.00 per hour hired after May 1, 2017
- i. Village Police Auxiliary Police Patrol Officer \$11.00 per hour
- j. Village Utility Plant Superintendent \$59,000.00 annually.
- k. Utility Plant Laborer \$12.50 per hour.
- l. Utility Operator in Training (passed test/insufficient hours) \$14.50 per hour
- m. Utility Class I Water or Sewer license \$15.00 per hour
- n. Utility Class I Water and Sewer license \$15.50 per hour
- o. Utility Class II Water or Sewer license \$16.00 per hour
- p. Utility Class II Water and Sewer license \$16.50 per hour

Section 2: That all benefits associated with the employees subject to this Ordinance shall continue as established by previous Village Ordinances.

Section 3: That any inconsistent herewith previously passed by this Council with regard to rates of pay for the positions herein referenced are hereby repealed.

Section 4: This Ordinance is deemed an emergency measure for the safety and welfare of the community for the reason that Council desires that this Ordinance take effect as soon as possible for the benefit of our dedicated employees; whereas, this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage.
